		<p>country, in North London. They were most famous between 1963 and 1966.</p> <p>The Kinks' music drew from a wide range of influences which were a little different to the Beatles. They also liked American R&B and rock and roll but later started to also use British music hall, folk, and country music.</p> <p>They also wrote a song about the summer... and also one about a London sunset.</p>	
19.6.23	Trust	<p>Summertime - this song is from an opera called 'Porgy and Bess' written by George Gershwin. 26.6.23	Respect (Eid predicted this week)	<p>Respect - Aretha Franklin and Otis Redding.</p> <p>Aretha Franklin (March 25, 1942 – August 16, 2018) was an American singer, songwriter and pianist. She started singing as a child when she sang gospel at the church where her dad was the minister. When she was 18, In 1960, she began to sing more secular music (this means songs which were not religious). 		<p>label and started to release lots of hits that were considered 'Soul music'. Soul music mixes rhythm and blues, gospel and pop music. It started in the 1960s in America. Soul is energetic music singing of love, dance and life.</p> <p>Aretha was known as 'The Queen of soul'. She sang for over 5 decades and was still performing well into the 70s.</p> <p>One of her most famous songs is 'Respect'. It isn't actually her song! It was written and recorded by Otis Redding (named 'The King of Soul'). It is so famous that many artists have performed their own versions of it. Here is a dance version by Melanie Amaro (a USA X factor winner).</p>	
<p>3.7.23</p>	<p>Respect</p>	<p>The Staple Singers were an American gospel, soul, and R&B singing group. Roebuck "Pops" Staples is the dad who put the group together with his children Cleotha, Pervis and Mavis. His daughter Yvonne replaced her brother when he joined the U.S. Army, and again in 1970. They are best known for their 1970s hits "Respect Yourself" and "I'll Take You There". The family name is actually Staples, but they use "Staple" in their band name.</p> <p>They started by singing in churches. Roebuck's brother was a vicar. It was released just after the American Civil Rights movement and its message of self-empowerment appealed to people. The message tells you that no one is going to respect you if you don't respect yourself. If everyone took care of themselves, issues like racism wouldn't exist.</p> <p>It even tells the listener to 'put your hand on your mouth when you cough, that'll help the solution' and not to swear, 'think that'll make you a big ol man?'.
